

Homemade Window Clings

Another form of home-made decals are these Homemade Window Clings. Their natural texture lets them stick to any smooth surface and are easy to remove, leaving no trace!

Materials:

- Clear dry liquid glue
- Black Sharpie marker
- Paints
- Several containers for paint
- Water
- Decal designs
- Plastic sleeves used for protecting papers
- Paint brushes or fine tipped squeeze bottles
- Patience



First start by choosing a pattern and printing it out or making it yourself. Then put it in the plastic sleeve and draw over the outline with a black sharpie marker.

Next we will make our paints by adding glue into one of the empty paint containers. Always start with a little bit. Then add the colour paint you want it to be.

Note:

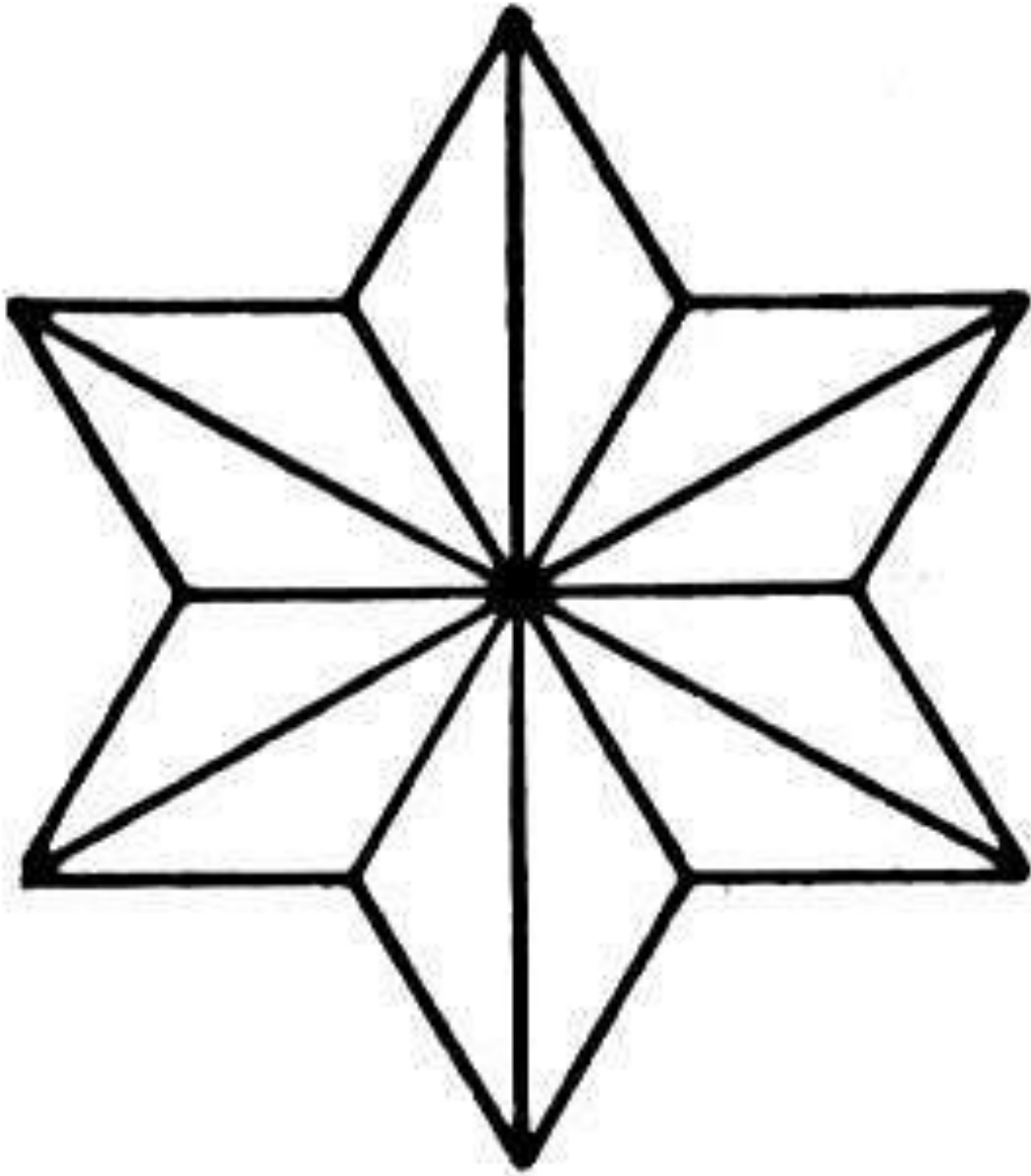
- Blue, red, and yellow are primary colours and cannot be made by mixing others.
- ALWAYS start with a little bit of one colour and slowly add more, especially darker colours like blue.

Red + Yellow = Orange
Red + Blue = Purple
Yellow + Blue = Green

If you're happy with the colour but the paint is too thick add a little bit of water to thin it out. When you are happy with the paint use a paint brush or a squeeze bottle to fill in your pattern and wait for it to dry. Drying may take a few hours.

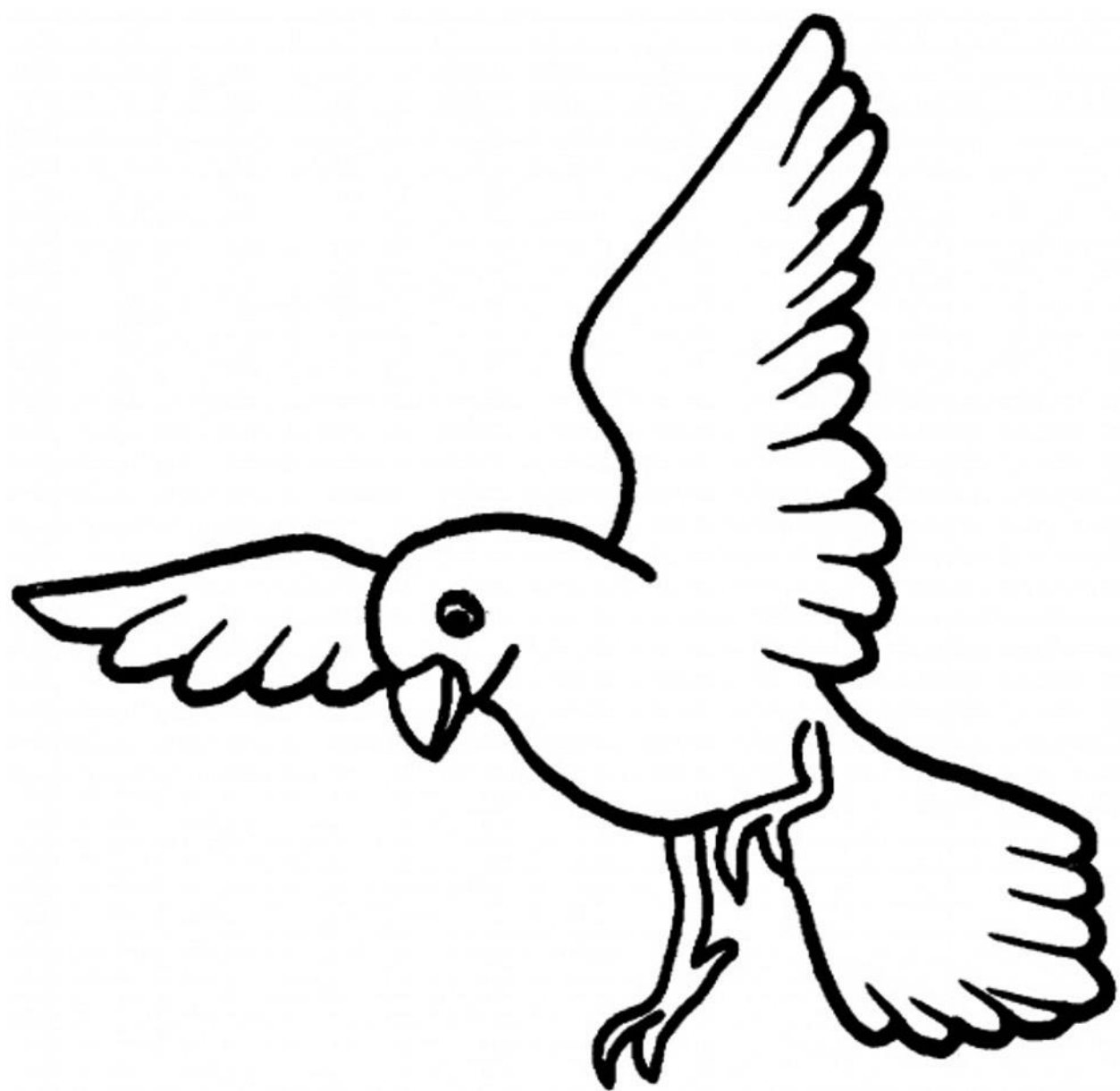
After you are sure it is dry slowly and gently peel off the image, be very careful not to tear it. If it does tear put it back on the plastic and repaint the spot with the tear, wait for it to dry and try to peel it off again.

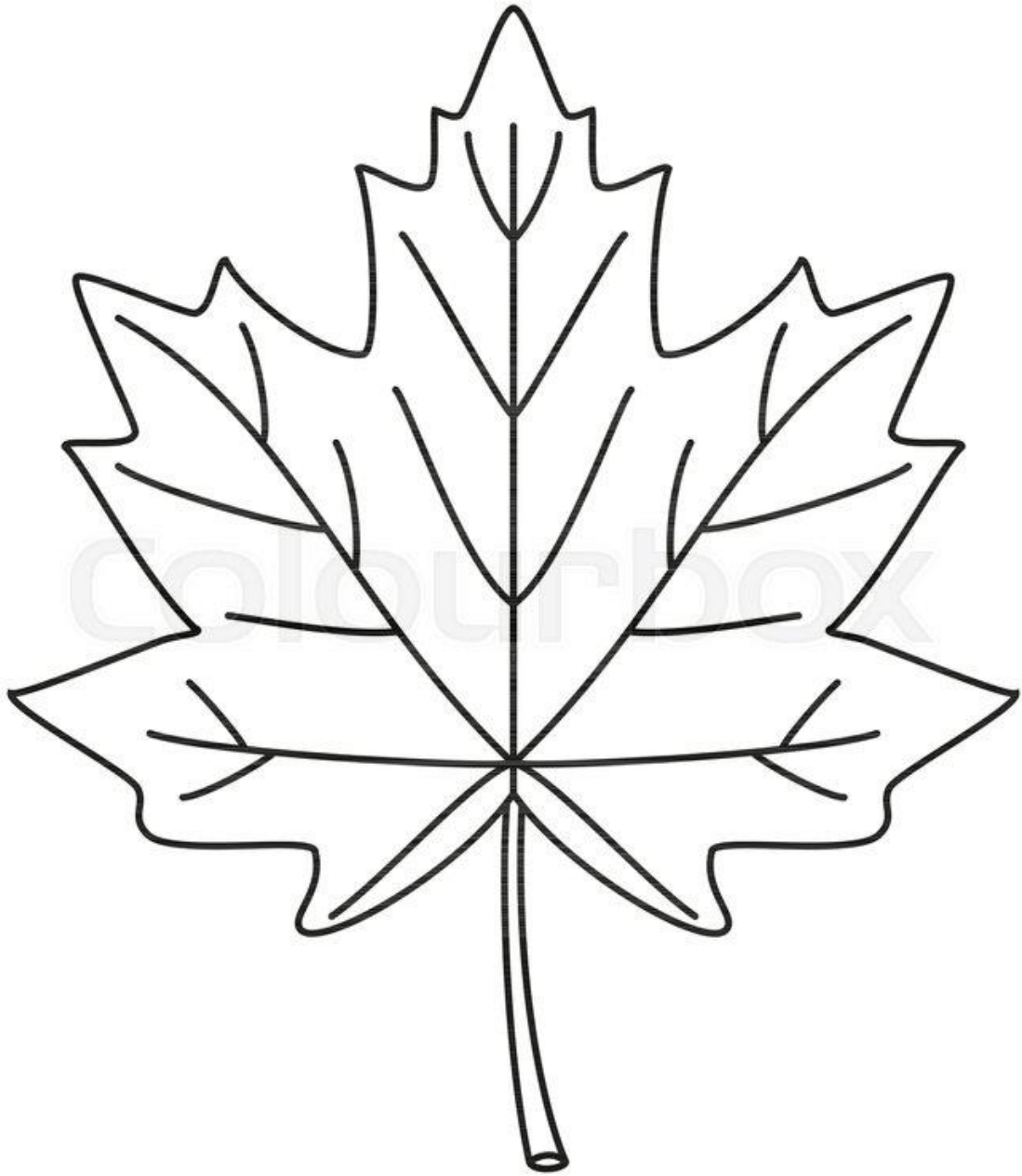
Now you can apply your Window Clings to your windows, just make sure to space each Window Cling at least 2-4" apart to effectively bird proof your window!



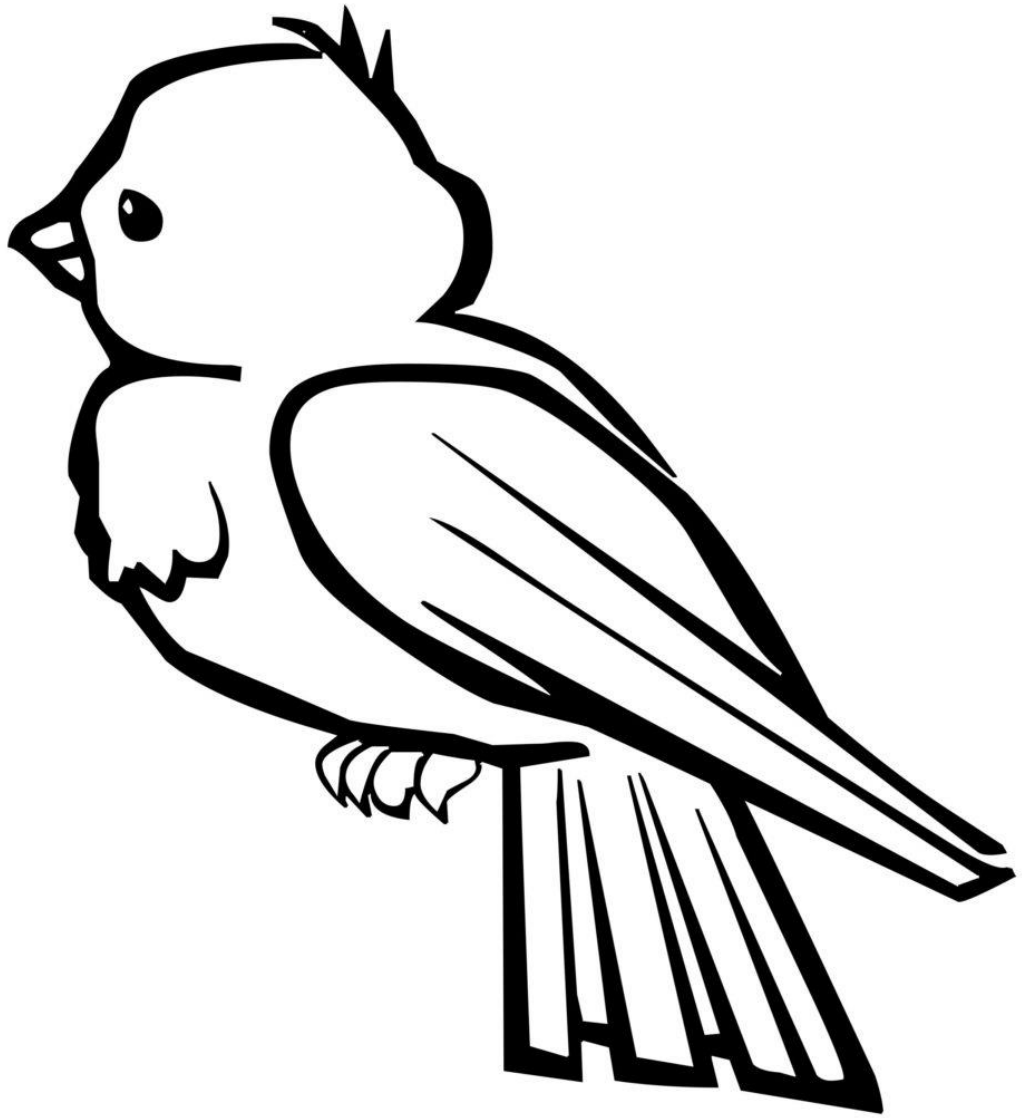


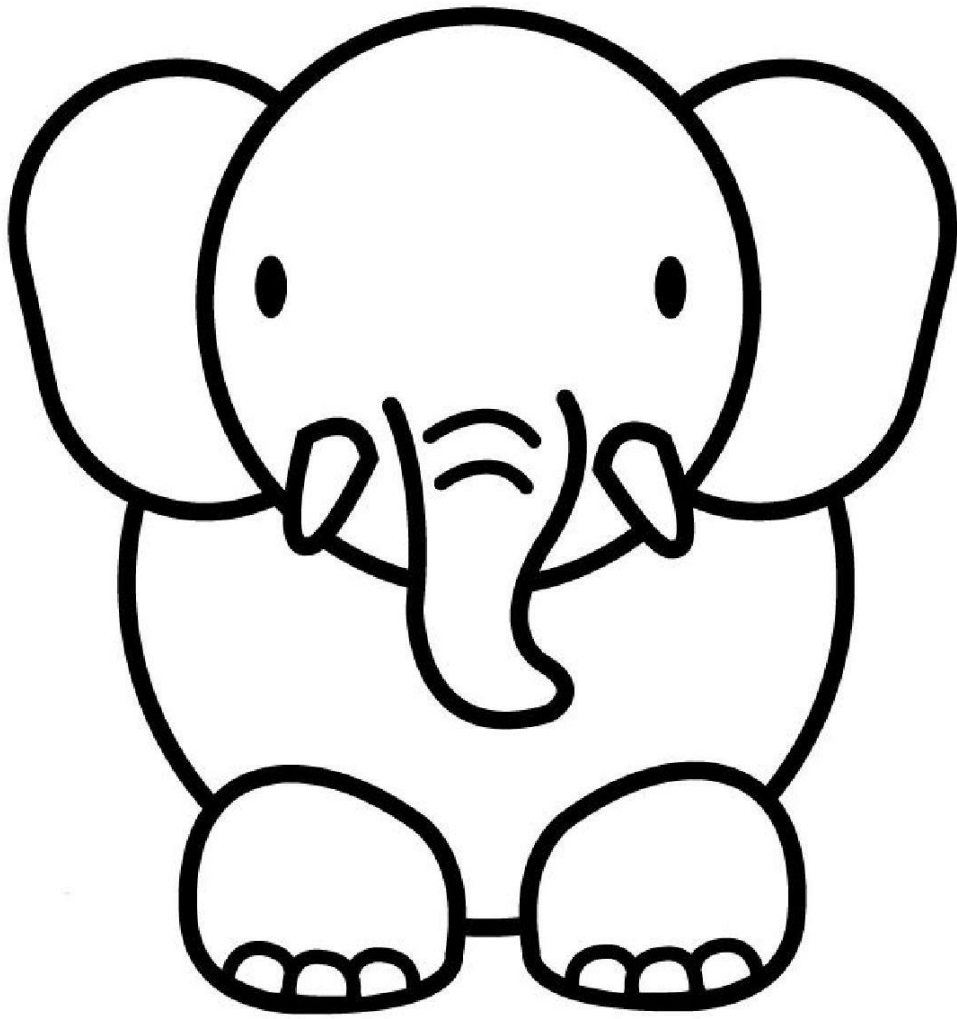
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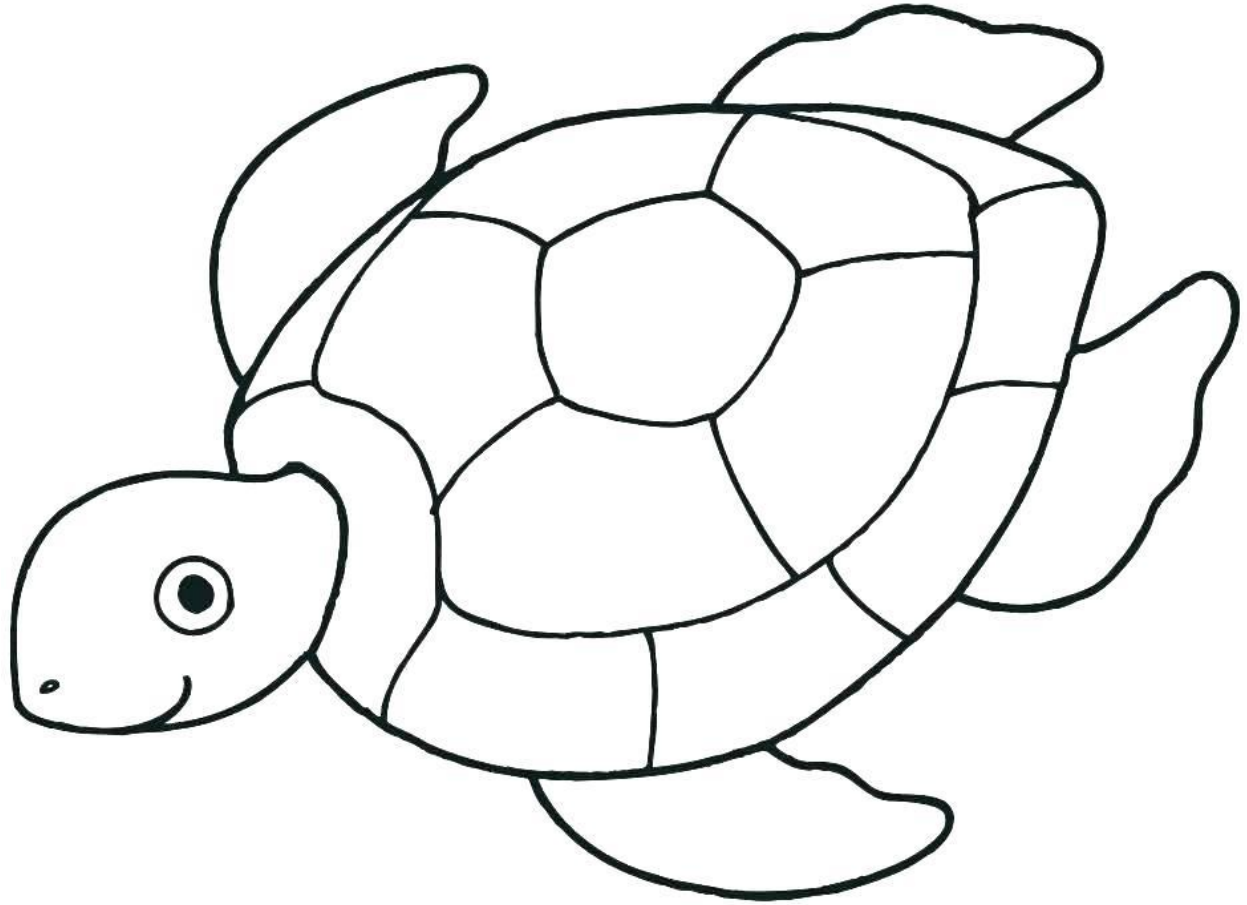














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
